#### Our Vision:

We want to nurture creative thinkers. Our intent is to ensure music is accessible for every student. Music enables us to experience the world around us and gives us the tools to explore it in a safe environment. We want our students to be able to use Music as an expressive tool where they don't always have the vocabulary. This ensures our students leave YHS as Resilient, Aspirational and Successful contributors to society.

The vision for the Performing Arts Department at York High School is one that is at the core of the community that we serve. One that not only provides excellent Music and Drama provision within the classroom, which creates creative thinkers, problem solvers, performers and composers but also one which provides the opportunity for cultural capital for all students and contributes to a happy school.

Curriculum Design	
We have gained an extra hour at KS3 meaning that our students now receive 2 hours of Drama and 2 hours of Music over a 2 week timetable. This brings us in line with the DfE's recommendation of the equivalent of 1hr of Music a week at KS3.	Lessons need to be written alongside PoS and shared with all staff.
We have planned our extended curriculum to accommodate the extra hours.	Ensure interleaving of skills is evident and explicit throughout.
Since January 2022, we have overhauled both our KS3 curriculum and KS4 curriculum and changed GCSE exam boards.	Continue to monitor our GCSE results and implement change where the need is identified.
